Subject: Comments, 2021 Redistricting, Draft Map review (11/17/21 Agenda item 4)

Supervisors,

I reviewed the draft maps for 2021 Sacramento County supervisor districts that were presented by your County Consultant at the 10/25/2021 Planning Commission Hearing. Though I have not had time to review all districts, I do provide the following comments regarding **District 1:** 

- Drafts NDC 201 and NDC 202 do not adequately consider the huge amount of future growth that is expected in Natomas and other District 1 areas within the next 10 years.
  - North Natomas alone is expected to add over 10,000 new homes within the next 10 years.
    Approved projects include North Lake, Panhandle, Tanzanite, River Oaks, Railyards, and 2000+ units of added apartment projects actively building and/or submitting permits now.
- The Redistricting Rules & Goals for determining district boundaries include: 1) Substantially Equal Population, and 2) *Future population growth*. Therefore, per these rules, I request that District 1 boundaries be sized with strong consideration for its large future population growth. District 1's deviation from ideal should start below 0.00%.
  - In draft NDC 201, District 1 has nearly 5,000 more residents (4,758) and the largest deviation from ideal (+1.50%). It also has thousands more residents than other districts.
  - In draft NDC 202, District 1 is more equitably sized but is still starting out with the highest positive deviation from ideal of all districts (0.63%) and over 1500 more residents than the next largest district.
  - Draft NDC 203 is the only proposal that somewhat considers the large future growth of District 1 with a 0.00% deviation from the ideal.
- District 1 also includes two major county master plan projects proposing to build huge new communities in District 1 in the upcoming decade. Grand Park (aka Natomas North Precinct) proposes building 23,515 dwelling units north of Natomas (east of hwy 99). West Park, in the Nstomas "boot" area, estimates adding 25,574 residents. These two projects alone would add over 49,000 residents to District 1 in the upcoming decade.

I realize it is a very, very difficult task to determine district boundaries in an equitable manner. But fundamentally, by combining downtown Sacramento City with several large, new growth areas (North Natomas, South Natomas, Railyards, North & West county), District 1 will <u>start</u> this decade with less-equal representation for allocation of state and federal funding vs. other districts. The disparity will only grow much worse as District 1 becomes much larger in population as expected. Other districts are also growing, but not as much as District 1.

I therefore request your Board direct the consultants to size District 1 giving more consideration to the fact that it will grow much larger in population in the upcoming years.
