

## Summary of On-line and Workshop Comments

- □ Rancho Murieta belongs in District 5 and Gold River belongs in District 3.
- Keep unincorporated communities such as Fair Oaks, Foothill Farms and Carmichael together.
- Describing the Caselman Ranch community, with borders on Elk Grove-Florin Road and Caselman Drive. Expressed desire to remain in District 2.
- Describing West Arden Arcade, its differences from Arden Oaks, Sierra Oaks, and Arden Manor, and desire to keep it together.
- Gold River in Dist. 4 is not compact. Rosemont and Gold River belong with Rancho Cordova, and the old Cordova Planning area should be kept together.
- The LGTBQ community is a community of interest, and maps will be submitted showing the location.



#### Three NDC map options




### Andres Ramos Draft Maps




### Sofia Cardenas Draft Maps



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





